## York Region to officially open York Region Transit/Viva building at the Community Safety Village

Visiting Grade 3 students to explore building for the first time

**NEWMARKET** – The Regional Municipality of York is officially opening a York Region Transit (YRT)\Viva building at the Community Safety Village of York Region on Tuesday, June 19<sup>th</sup>. An official ribbon-cutting ceremony will take place during the grand opening, followed by children in Grade 3 from St. Anne's Catholic School in the Town of Richmond Hill invited to explore the YRT\Viva building for the first time.

Inside the new building, YRT staff have developed an interactive learning experience for children to help educate and encourage the safe use of transit. Activities include a 90-second animated music video created by Niagara College students, a miniature transit bus and three puzzle tables.

- The Community Safety Village of York Region is an outdoor miniature village containing paved roads and sidewalks, operating traffic lights, working railway crossing signals and lights, a live hydro substation, 9-1-1 phone simulator, stationary school bus, playground and 30 small buildings
- The village attracts approximately 25,000 school children per year
- Visitors can also explore a miniature police station, fire hall, ambulance station, bus terminal, school and church for additional learning
