New \$14.6 million recreational facility and paramedic response station opens in the Township of King

KING – The Township of King, in partnership with The Regional Municipality of York and the Federal and Provincial governments, will hold a ceremony to mark the official opening of the Trisan Centre – a new recreational facility and paramedic response station in the Township of King.

WHEN: Monday, June 27
Official opening ceremony begins at 10 a.m.

WHERE: Intersection of Proctor Road and Dillane Drive, Schomberg
Township of King

Features of the new facility include a full size 68,000-square foot single National Hockey League (NHL) ice pad, four curling sheets, a fitness facility and an indoor walking/running track.

The ceremony also includes the official opening of a new York Region EMS Paramedic Response Station housed alongside the new recreational facility. Features of the response station include a two-bay garage, designed and built to enable improved paramedic response for the northwest quadrant of King Township.

This project is co-funded by the Canada-Ontario Infrastructure Stimulus Fund, The Regional Municipality of York and The Township of King.
