York Region Emergency Management works closely with local municipal Community Emergency Management Coordinators throughout the year on a variety of operational issues and to foster program integration across York Region. Emergency Management begins at the local Municipal level under the direction and guidance of the Community Emergency Management Coordinator (CEMC). It is recommended that each municipal Accessibility Advisory Committee (AAC) liaise with the local CEMC regarding information on their municipality's respective Emergency Management Programs.
