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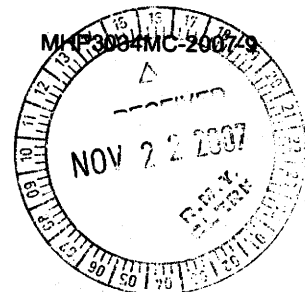

Dear Mr. Kelly:

Thank you for your correspondence, addressed to my predecessor, the Honourable Jim Watson, regarding smoking in cars where children are passengers. I have noted council's resolution.

The *Smoke-Free Ontario Act* (SFOA) prohibits smoking in enclosed workplaces and enclosed public places in order to protect workers and the public from the hazards of second-hand smoke. The legislation is designed to strike a balance between the need to protect the health of Ontarians and the need to respect their personal freedoms.

The provincial government is committed to the Smoke-Free Ontario Strategy – the most comprehensive tobacco-control strategy Ontario has ever had, and among the toughest and most far-reaching in North America. The SFOA is an important part of that strategy. We are also committed to helping people who want to quit smoking.

At this time, the government is focused on the implementation of the Smoke-Free Ontario Strategy. We do not currently intend to take legislative measures to enforce a ban on smoking in cars that have children as passengers.

Thank you again for bringing council's views and concerns to the attention of the provincial government.
