What is HHW?

Any material that is corrosive, explosive, flammable, or poisonous. These items should be disposed of with caution.

What are examples of HHW?

Paints, pesticides, propane tanks, batteries, pharmaceuticals, syringes, thermostats containing mercury, used motor oil and filters, fuels and many cleaning products. *New for 2006: fluorescent light tubes and energy efficient bulbs.*

How do I dispose of my HHW?

- Keep materials in original containers, or ensure that the contents are clearly labelled
- Do not mix different products together
- Tightly cap all containers
- Bring them to your local HHW depot free of charge

Please note:

- No commercial, industrial or medical office wastes accepted.
- No explosives (other than aerosols and propane cylinders), ammunition, PCBs, asbestos or radioactive wastes accepted.
- Needles and syringes from household medicinal use will be accepted in rigid containers only. No other pathological wastes will be accepted.

ACCEPTED

- Computers including modems, cables and software (e.g. disks, CDs, DVDs)
- Monitors, printers, scanners, electronic games (e.g. Nintendos)
- Telephones, pagers, fax machines
- VCRs, DVD players, radios, stereos (without audio speakers)
- Digital cameras, automobile "computer" modules

NOT ACCEPTED

- Televisions
- Electric calculators
- Electric typewriters
- Audio speakers
- Conventional cameras

Please note:

- Remove all packaging and batteries before delivering to a Household Hazardous Waste Depot.
- Batteries can be brought to a Household Hazardous Waste Depot.
- Thermostats, which contain mercury, must be delivered to a Household Hazardous Waste Depot.

Metal appliances include items such as refrigerators, freezers, stoves, etc.

How do I dispose of my metal appliances and scrap metal?
