National Access Awareness Week, (NAAW) was established in 1988 to promote better access for people with disabilities. This happened in response to a request from Rick Hansen, following his Man in Motion World Tour. Rick Hansen wheeled 40,000 km through 34 countries for two years, two months and two days on his Man in Motion World Tour.

The primary aim of NAAW is to bring together people with disabilities, organizations who serve people with disabilities, business, labour and government, to facilitate changes that allow the full participation of people with disabilities in all aspects of Canadian life; in the areas of education, leisure, transportation, housing and employment.

NAAW serves as a reminder of the importance for all individuals, businesses and government partners to work together to promote an inclusive and barrier-free community.

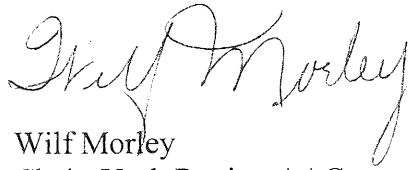
