7. NOTICE OF MOTION

- (a) At the Council Meeting of October 12th, 2004, Councillor Pellegrini put forward a Motion requesting York Region Transit to consider re-routing the Seneca College bus to include the King City area:

Whereas senior citizens and other residents of King City require transportation on a regular basis; and

Whereas the residents of the 15th Sideroad between Bathurst Street and Dufferin Street have requested that the bus route to Seneca College be altered to reduce traffic on the 15th Sideroad;

It is hereby resolved:

That Council of the Corporation of the Township of King request York Region Transit to consider re-routing the Seneca College buses to relieve the intense traffic situation on the 15th Sideroad and to provide regular transit service to enable residents of the King City area to access the Regional Transit system and to be able to travel freely throughout the Region.

A motion was made by Councillor Pellegrini, seconded by Councillor Cober and carried that the above-noted resolution be adopted.
