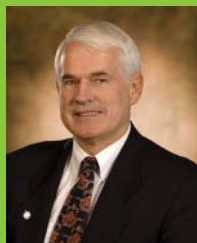

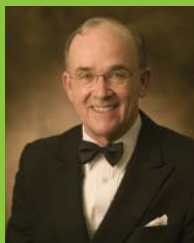

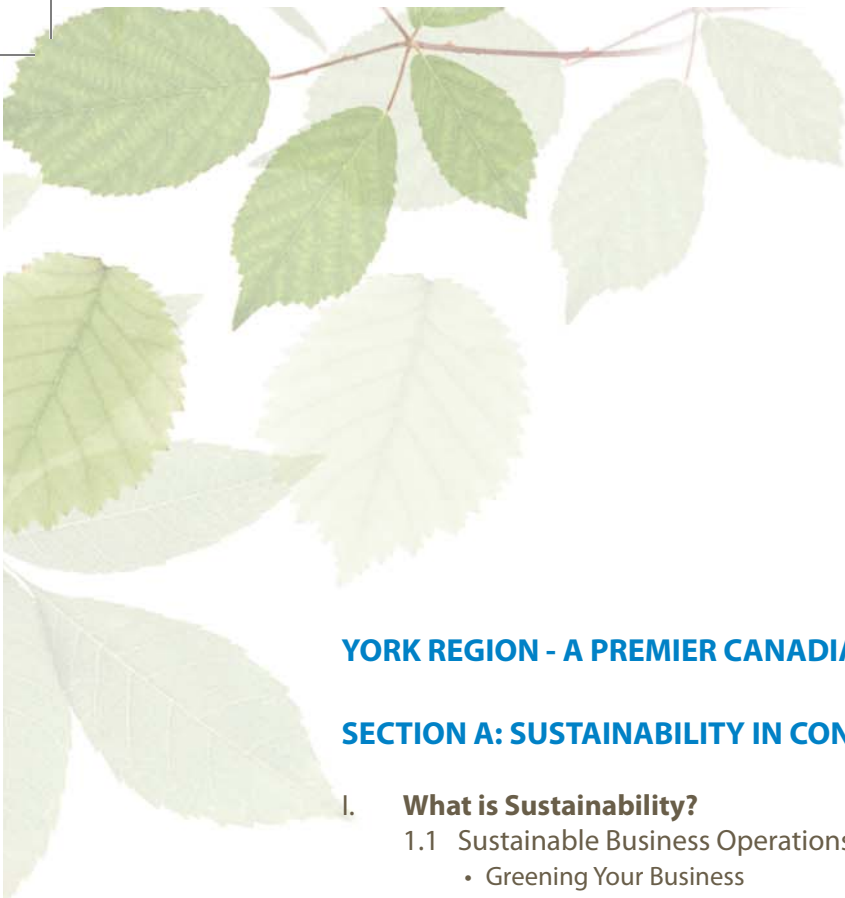

SECTION A: SUSTAINABILITY IN CONTEXT



In a marketplace where consumers are increasingly aware of, and responsive to environmental issues, it is becoming essential to “go green” in order to remain competitive. Greening your business means pursuing knowledge and practices that will lead to more environmentally friendly and ecologically responsible decisions. In addition to helping protect the environment and sustaining its natural resources, it also generates a number of favourable commercial and financial outcomes.

This guide has been produced to help your business navigate the waters of green business initiatives, and will explore the following areas:

- Understanding sustainability
- Exploring the opportunities for operating an efficient or green business
- Exploring the opportunities for launching a green product
- Discovering sustainability initiatives in York Region
- Providing the resources available to facilitate the process of sustainability

I. WHAT IS SUSTAINABILITY?

York Region’s Sustainability Strategy, released in 2007, defines sustainability as leaving our communities, our Region, and our world in a healthy state for our children and grandchildren. It means evaluating the social, economic and environmental effects of our actions, and learning to optimize all three; businesses have long referred to this as the ‘triple bottom line’. Instead of trading these elements against one another, sustainability helps you see the relationships between them, and more accurately forecast the challenges and opportunities that may arise in the future.

The social, economic and environmental benefits of pursuing sustainability are:

- Differentiate yourself from the competition
- Meet the changing needs of customers
- Create innovative new products or processes
- Reduce energy, waste and costs
- Open new markets
- Attract and retain the best employees
- Improve your image with shareholders and the public
- Reduce legal risks and insurance costs
- Provide a higher quality of life for the community in which you live / work

There are two approaches to greening your business that will be reviewed in more detail: modifying your business operations to become more environmentally sustainable, and launching green products or services to capitalize on consumers’ increasing demand.



1.1 SUSTAINABLE BUSINESS OPERATIONS

The environmental sector includes a broad range of constantly evolving products, services and technologies that cut across industry classifications and are used to measure, correct or prevent damage to water, soil and air and limit energy consumption. It is based on new technologies, leading edge research and forward thinking ideas that reinforce a knowledge-based economy. Companies and governments around the world purchase these environmental services to enhance the sustainability of their operations.

The rapidly growing global environment market is currently valued at \$628 billion USD and is being driven by concerns for environmental protection, climate change, clean air and water, and demands for cleaner production and pollution prevention.¹ Growth has been evidenced in every area of the sector. Since 2000 when the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) rating system was born, projects have grown as much as 700% a year.²

Growth in the environmental sector will be significantly affected by a greater regulatory climate such as the implementation of the Kyoto Accord, the need for urban infrastructure and future constraints on natural resources. With a highly competitive global market, not only large corporations, but small to medium sized businesses are seeking a competitive edge. In order to maintain relationships in supply change management, companies must demonstrate environmental compliance. Growing consumer awareness has motivated companies to incorporate environmental measures in all stages of their product / service cycles.



Opportunities in Innovative Energy Sources

With the rising cost of oil and other fossil fuels, and to reduce dependence on these sources of energy, alternative sources are continually being researched and developed that seek to improve the environment. The opportunities that exist to develop these new energy sources include:

- **Alternative Transportation Fuels**, such as ethanol, made primarily from grains or other renewable agricultural and agro-forestry feed stocks, emits fewer greenhouse gases on a life-cycle basis.
- **Biomass Energy**, derived from industrial or agricultural by-products, represents a potentially large source of renewable energy. York Region in its 2008 budget has approved \$4.9 million in enhancements for transit which include the conversion of the VIVA rapid transit bus fleet to more environmentally friendly biodiesel.
- **Geothermal Technology** includes earth energy systems, ground-source heat pumps and water source heat pumps. These systems move heat from the ground to a building for heat and the opposite for cooling producing less carbon dioxide and atmospheric pollutants than conventional systems. Earth Rangers in Vaughan is one of the first buildings in Canada to be completely heated and cooled with thermally activated radiant slabs.
- **Hydrogen** can be used as a transportation fuel or in stationary power applications using fuel cells for cell phones, laptops, heating, cooling, and electricity.
- **Hydroelectric Power** opportunities exist to further utilize Ontario's waterpower resources for renewable energy. In 2007 PowerStream's service area, the largest service area in York Region, saved over 33 million kilowatt-hours of electricity due to conservation programs.
- **Solar Energy**, either photovoltaic or thermal, has become the fastest growing alternative energy technology globally. In 2007 York Region installed a solar wall at Elmwood Gardens, a seniors' residence in Stouffville operated by the non-profit housing corporation, HousingYork Inc.
- **Wind Energy** creates no hazardous waste or emissions and is becoming increasingly important. In January 2006, York Region approved a 12-month project to monitor wind energy at the Sutton Water Pollution Control Plant (WPCP). The project will provide valuable information toward the development of a business case on constructing wind energy.

Greening Your Business

Companies of all sizes have realized the benefits of effective environmental management through initiatives that not only lessen their environmental impact, but also improve their financial and business results. Many companies have achieved short-term and long-term cost savings with minimal up front costs or no capital investment, realizing the majority of these savings through improved process efficiency, waste reduction and increased energy efficiency. With all of the competition in today's market, businesses looking for a marketable and socially responsible competitive advantage are turning to the implementation of sustainable business practices.

If you are considering implementing a sustainability strategy for your business, you will need shared goodwill plus workable systems. Help create a green office culture with a management plan that harnesses the commitment of everyone in your workplace – starting with the simple things like making recycling easy by ensuring everyone has collection bins at their desks. Provide briefings, signs, and other information to explain and encourage ways to conserve energy and minimize waste.

Establish a Steering Committee to facilitate the implementation of sustainability. Task forces and project teams can work on individual projects. For example, one team might conduct a greenhouse gas audit, while another plans the remodel. Depending on the size of your business, and the scope of the change you will implement, it may be helpful to hire a professional facilitator to lead these efforts.

Assess the status of your current environmental management. This assessment will provide a foundation for developing goals, strategies and action plans that improve environmental management at every level of your organization.

Determine the Scope of Your Remodel depending on the results of your assessment. Some key factors to implementing these ideas are acceptance by all levels within the organization, continuous training of employees, and well-documented processes. Some important topics to consider are:

- **Waste Reduction.** The cost for waste disposal is a large part of a business's operating budget, increasing as the quantity increases, or as the waste becomes more hazardous. Businesses can reduce or eliminate these costs through recycling, reuse, or more efficient use of raw materials in processes.
- **Material Substitution.** By conducting a focused analysis, manufacturers have discovered that some inputs can be replaced by less harmful materials, resulting in reduced waste generated and minimizing the risk to employees.
- **Product Reformulation.** Implementing a systematic review of production activities can identify new opportunities for efficiency and potential cost savings.
- **Process Modification.** Although process modifications may be capital-intensive, the investment may pay off in very little time.
- **Improved Energy Efficiency.** Whether the energy source is electricity, natural gas, or propane, the increasing cost of energy has become a significant business issue. There are many opportunities for process or operational changes that can increase the energy efficiency of production.
- **Reduce Fleet Emissions or Costs.** By using high octane fuel, purchasing efficient vehicles or sourcing out local suppliers, dramatic cost reductions can be accomplished.



Establish a Model to Guide Your Actions. Many organizations have found that pursuing sustainability award programs or a certification system has provided a powerful framework and incentive for progress. For example, you may follow Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) for a building remodel, or ISO 14000 for an environmental management system. Following an award program or certification system gives clear structure, standards, and if you qualify, public recognition.

Illustration: Achieving a Carbon Neutral Status

Many companies that are investing in clean technologies are striving to achieve a carbon neutral status. This is a credible and marketable attribute that declares a company’s commitment to sustainability. Here are the steps involved:

- Calculate your footprint: your own operations, your suppliers’ operations, and users of products. For an online carbon calculator, visit www.carbonneutral.com.
- Reduce your emissions:
 - Turn to green power – solar, wind, hydro
 - Turn out the lights – lighting accounts for over 20% of greenhouse gas emissions
 - Procurement – favour local trade
 - Reduce fleet emissions and costs
 - Use high octane fuel – it is more efficient and burns cleaner
 - Utilize virtual meetings
- When it is impractical or uneconomic to further cut emissions, Carbon Offset strategies enable you to help finance new, low carbon technologies and innovations. Visit www.carbonneutral.com for details.

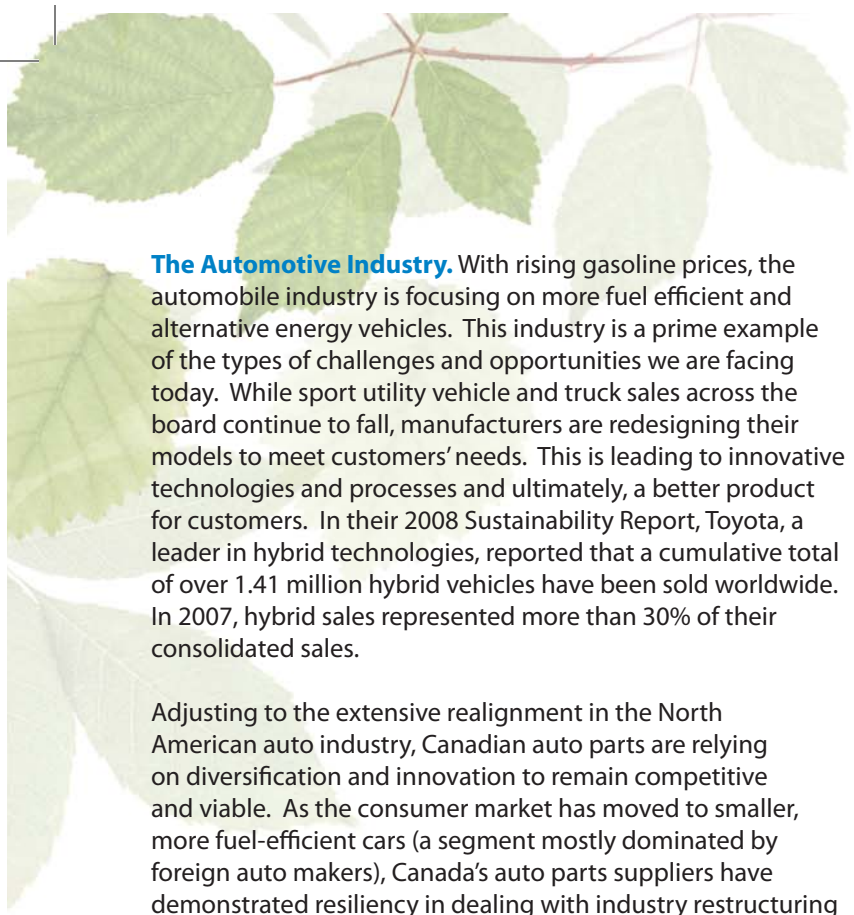

1.2 THE GREEN PRODUCT REVOLUTION

The rapidly growing consumer market for green goods and services is unlocking an excess of opportunities for green innovation. Environmentally-conscious consumers are turning to green products to meet their ethical needs, and to benefit from using safe and efficient products. The size of the green market still remains much smaller than what consumers’ stated environmental concerns indicate it should be, presenting incredible opportunities for new product development.

Green for Every Industry
Many companies are capitalizing on this growing industry by creating innovative green products or services. A few of the industries are profiled here:



The Automotive Industry. With rising gasoline prices, the automobile industry is focusing on more fuel efficient and alternative energy vehicles. This industry is a prime example of the types of challenges and opportunities we are facing today. While sport utility vehicle and truck sales across the board continue to fall, manufacturers are redesigning their models to meet customers' needs. This is leading to innovative technologies and processes and ultimately, a better product for customers. In their 2008 Sustainability Report, Toyota, a leader in hybrid technologies, reported that a cumulative total of over 1.41 million hybrid vehicles have been sold worldwide. In 2007, hybrid sales represented more than 30% of their consolidated sales.

Adjusting to the extensive realignment in the North American auto industry, Canadian auto parts are relying on diversification and innovation to remain competitive and viable. As the consumer market has moved to smaller, more fuel-efficient cars (a segment mostly dominated by foreign auto makers), Canada's auto parts suppliers have demonstrated resiliency in dealing with industry restructuring by expanding their business globally, and working with North American companies on clean air technology and alternative energy systems.

Canada's 2008 Federal Budget included a \$250 million Automotive Innovation Fund for the development of new environmentally sustainable and fuel efficient vehicles. The Budget also allocated some \$669 million through to 2009-2010 to establish environmental initiatives which include environmental technologies such as carbon capture and storage, the creation of a regulatory framework for industrial air emissions, and the development of a pilot program to demonstrate ethanol-gasoline fueling and commercialization.

Green Commercial Buildings. Buildings that are more environmentally sound in their construction, and energy-efficient in their operations, have typically been considered part of a niche market over the past ten years. With heating fuel prices rising, and the active development of Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED), it is arguable that green buildings are quickly becoming the new standard in Canada.

LEED Canada is an adaptation of the US Green Building Council's LEED Green Building Rating System, tailored specifically for Canadian climates, construction practices and regulations. The prerequisites and credits necessary for certification are organized in five principal categories: sustainable sites, water efficiency, energy and atmosphere, materials and resources, and indoor environmental quality. An additional category, innovation and design process, addresses sustainable building expertise as well as design measures not covered under these five environmental categories. With four possible levels of certification (certified, silver, gold and platinum), LEED is flexible enough to accommodate a wide range of green building strategies that best fit the constraints and goals of particular projects.

Canada boasts over 100 LEED certified projects since it was introduced in 2004 (with 35% coming from Ontario), ranging from commercial buildings to Government institutions, public health facilities, school boards and universities/colleges. 2007 saw the completion of 36 new projects, representing a 38% increase over 2006. This trend will continue to develop in the future, with more than 900 projects currently registered in Canada, and registration growing monthly.



Green Homes. The number of energy-efficient new homes being built across Canada is exploding as more and more homeowners realize the financial and environmental benefits of going green. Homebuilders are getting the green rubber stamp by Natural Resources Canada, the federal government department that administers the rating system for energy-efficient homes through its EnerGuide rating system.

While there may be higher initial costs associated with adding energy-efficient upgrades and features, potential buyers seem content with that. A recent survey by EnerQuality Corporation of 2,089 homebuyers of new homes in the Greater Toronto Area and the Ottawa-Carleton Regions, showed that 94% of respondents agreed that energy efficiency reduces operating costs even if it will cost more initially.

The ENERGY STAR® for New Homes initiative promotes energy efficiency guidelines that enable new homes to be approximately 30% more energy efficient than those built to minimum provincial building codes. The energy efficiency measures that builders typically incorporate include heating / cooling systems, ducts, windows, patio doors, skylights, walls, ceilings, and ventilation.

Since the program began in 2005, the number of Ontario builders registered for the ENERGY STAR® for New Homes initiative has increased 50% with the number of homes enrolled more than doubling to 10,000 between 2006 and 2007.

In addition, the Canada Green Building Council is actively developing a Canadian version of the LEED for Homes rating system for launch in spring 2009, as there is growing demand for a residential version of LEED in Canada and for a national green and rating system for housing.



Services. Green experiences are starting to surface in the service industry. Day cares, hotels, hair salons, spas and restaurants are making green a part of their marketing campaign, distinguishing themselves from their competitors by offering to use green products, policies and activities throughout the service experience.

The Hotel Association of Canada's (HAC) Green Key Eco-Rating Program is a graduated rating system designed to recognize hotels, motels, and resorts that are committed to improving their fiscal and environmental performance. Based on the results of a comprehensive environmental audit, hoteliers are awarded a 1-5 Green Key rating and given guidance on how to reduce operating costs and environmental impacts through reduced utility consumption, employee training, and supply chain management.

The program is related to the following areas of sustainable hotel operations:

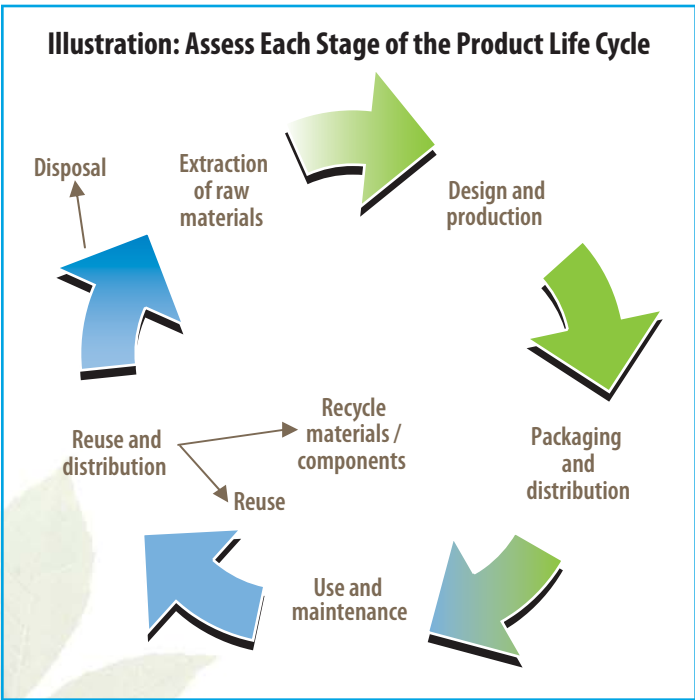
- Energy conservation
- Water conservation
- Solid waste management
- Hazardous waste management
- Indoor air quality
- Community outreach
- Building infrastructure
- Land use
- Environmental management

The opportunities to develop green goods and services are endless, and the consumer market is ready and waiting.

Launching a Green Product

Launching a green product or service means altering an existing product to contain new environmentally friendly features. For many companies, this might mean altering their operations, or launching an extension to a product line. It may also mean entering a brand new territory of products or services.

During the product creation process, designers may look at the source, makeup, and toxicity of raw materials; the energy and resources required in manufacturing the product; and how the product can be recycled or reused at the end of its life. Balanced with other product considerations such as quality, price and functionality, eco-designed products are environmentally and economically viable alternatives to traditional products. Smart green design creates products that use less energy and natural resources; products that can be recycled easily or reused; products that contain environmentally harmless ingredients / raw materials; and products that promote efficiency in consumers' lives.



Once the product has been created, it becomes a marketable opportunity to generate public relations and an advertising campaign highlighting the environmentally-friendly offer.

In an effort to minimize consumer eco-confusion, the Canadian Competition Bureau in collaboration with the Canadian Standards Association, has released Canadian guidelines to help companies and advertisers avoid making false environmental claims about a company or product. 1.3 A PROMISING FUTURE

Canada’s environmental sector adds value to the economy by increasing productivity and creating employment, while improving quality of life and helping to protect the environment. The environmental market in Canada consists of some 8,500 firms with small firms (with fewer than 100 employees) forming the majority.

In 2004, Canadian firms earned \$18.5 billion from sales of environmental goods and services.³ In that same year approximately 251,000 people were employed in the Canadian environmental workforce, a growth rate of 13.7% between 1999 and 2003. This growth rate was 60% faster than the growth of the Canadian workforce as a whole over the same period. Between 2006 and 2011 it is expected that employment will grow at an annual average rate of 1.4% in all industries, contrasted by employment in the environment sector which is expected to increase by 1.6%.

Canadian environmental exports are worth more than \$1.5 billion per year, with companies exporting to Africa, Asia, South America, and Europe.

Ontario's rapidly growing environmental industry is recognized as a national and international leader in providing environmental goods and services. The Province is home to more than 2,600 innovative environmental firms and accounts for more than 48% of Canadian environmental revenues.⁴ Companies in Ontario are world leaders in water and wastewater treatment, solid and hazardous waste management, and air pollution prevention and control.

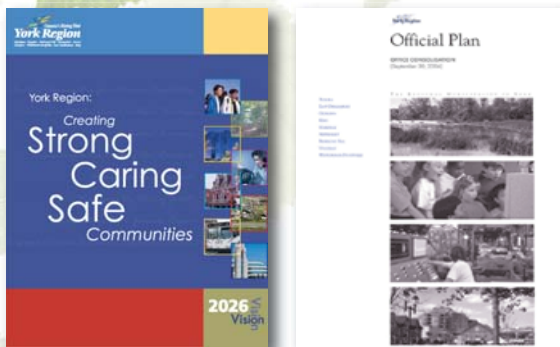
With a progressive immigration policy and a well established education infrastructure, Ontario produces a steady stream of over 62,000 environment industry workers from all over the world.⁵

To assist public research institutions and researchers, the government of Ontario has committed \$63 million over four years to attract pre-seed and seed money. Flexible terms are available for companies to acquire the rights to intellectual property developed in Ontario's public research centres.

In light of ever increasing global environmental challenges, the Canadian environmental industry is poised for a promising future. Many corporations are striving to demonstrate a commitment to sustainable development and are including continuous environmental improvement messages in their mission statements, are demonstrating a commitment to environmental mentoring, and are developing strong partnerships with government and the business community.

II. SUSTAINABILITY IN YORK REGION

Maintaining a healthy environmental balance is critical to York Region's prosperity and quality of life. The Region has established a strong vision for the future with two major strategic documents "Vision 2026" and "York Region Official Plan". Attracting high quality new investments from firms committed to sustainability and encouraging existing business in the Region to leverage "green" business practices respond to the goals of "Vision 2026" to enhance the environment while promoting a vibrant economy.

2.1 YORK REGION SUSTAINABILITY INITIATIVES

Corporate Clean Air is York Region's action plan committed to improving outdoor air quality and reducing Green House Gas (GHG) emissions. The Corporate Clean Air Steering Committee is developing four action plans including the Auto Trip Reduction Plan, Corporate Smog Alert Plan, Green Fleets Plan, and the Green Procurement Plan.

Energy and the Environment Management System (EEMS) is web-based software designed to capture energy consumption and expenses of buildings, streetlights and other facilities. The Region began implementation initiatives in 2005 with an aggressive 35% reduction target.

GTA Agricultural Action Plan focuses on issues facing agriculture such as land use and environmental pressures, and protects and promotes a healthy agriculture industry through cooperative partnerships between industry, government and agencies. The GTA Agricultural Action Committee was established to ensure the implementation of the Action Plan, and works to support the Agricultural Industry Sector in the GTA with an emphasis on health, community, environment and the promotion of local food.

The Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Plan (2002) and Greenbelt Act (2005) protect 69% of the Region from development. York Region is committed to preserving its natural heritage including farmlands, wetlands, kettle lakes, the Oak Ridges Moraine, and over 2,070 hectares of Regional forest.

Smart Commute Initiative is a joint demand management project led by York Region under the Federal Government’s Urban Transportation Showcase Program that encourages individuals to travel smarter, cleaner, and better by considering alternatives.

York Region Greening Strategy helps identify and protect vulnerable green spaces and calls for increased tree planting that will lead to a gradual increase in forest coverage from an existing 18% to 25%. These actions contribute to the health of York Region communities and help to ensure economic vitality that respects natural resources.

York Region Ground Water Monitoring Program measures water levels in over 200 observation wells throughout York Region. Water levels are like the ‘pulse’ of an aquifer, providing an indicator of the quantity of water available.

York Region Pedestrian and Cycling Master Plan Study was created to increase walking and cycling for commuters and for recreational purposes. The plan will provide a coordinated and integrated pedestrian and cycling system.

York Region Rapid Transit – VIVA is a bus rapid transit service that links the Regional urban centres, facilitates inter-Regional connectivity, and provides flexibility, convenience and frequent service. Vehicles operate on clean burning diesel fuel and meet the latest emission standards.

York Region Sustainability Strategy demonstrates the Region’s commitment to carefully fostering the environment, the Region’s communities and economy, and emphasizes engagement, monitoring and continuous improvement. The Strategy includes implementing a policy to provide incentives for high density development and includes Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification, which incorporates various sustainable, environmental elements into building design in the Regional Centres and Corridors. The Region’s first LEED certified multi-unit residential facility is Tom Taylor Place, a \$10 million project constructed in 2008 in Newmarket.

York Region Transportation Master Plan Update is underway to ensure that continuing transportation decisions for an integrated network can be made within the context of recent development trends and legislative changes.

York Region Waste Management Strategy aims to reduce waste by increasing the diversion rate from landfill sites. Under a three-stream recycling system, waste materials are separated and collected as organic waste (biodegradable materials) and recyclable materials (glass, paper, metal). All remaining materials are bagged as garbage for disposal. Approval has been received for the construction of three waste management facilities, Community Environmental Centres (CEC) for reusable goods, recyclables, building materials and yard waste. The first proposed location scheduled to open in January 2009 will be in the City of Vaughan.

York Region Water for Tomorrow provides building owners and managers free comprehensive audits of their facilities to assist in saving water. For small businesses, the installation of low flow showerheads and early-closing toilet flappers is provided at no cost.

- Clean energy technologies and energy conservation
- Instrumentation and analytical services
- Site remediation and brownfield redevelopment

Approximately 50% of the Region's environmental industry is in the service sector. Other sectors depend on these companies for new technologies and expertise to enhance their own innovation and performance. Since most companies in the environmental sector are small to medium-sized enterprises, there is an opportunity for companies in York Region to collaborate and take advantage of future growth in the sector.

Most companies in York Region have adopted environmental practices to some extent, and believe that implementing these practices has resulted in savings. Further efforts need to be made to encourage small companies to participate more actively in green initiatives and to communicate environmental initiatives to their clients. Opportunities exist for services and products that relate particularly to alternative energy and water conservation.¹

An Industry Ready Workforce

York Region's population is one of the youngest and best educated in Canada. Over 61% of York Region residents, between the ages of 25 and 64, have post-secondary education; this rating is higher than both the national and provincial averages.

Workers in the environmental sector tend to have a higher level of education than workers in all other industries and these workers have lower unemployment rates than in the general workforce. Knowledgeable workers in York Region's environmental sector are experienced in international environmental regulations and in the following disciplines:

Air pollution control. Emissions monitoring, assessment / evaluation and planning, and related consulting engineering and analytical services.

Water supply, treatment, and conservation. Consulting engineering, analytical, operational and maintenance services related to water purification, water delivery, wastewater treatment and storm water management.

Waste management and remediation. Hazardous and non-hazardous waste handling, collection, transport and disposal; operation and management of waste sites; operation of materials recovery facilities, including related consulting engineering and analytical services; emergency response and spills clean-up; maintenance and repair of remediation or treatment systems, including related consulting engineering and analytical services.

Environmental management systems. Development, evaluation or implementation of environmental management systems.

Environmental education, training and information. Environmental training and information for the public and the workplace (including environmental emergency response training and energy conservation training).

Research and development. Development, evaluation and implementation of clean process technologies and/or end-of-pipe pollution abatement and control technologies, including related consulting engineering and analytical services; research to improve knowledge of ecosystems and the impact of human activity on the environment.

Renewable energy and energy conservation. Installation, maintenance, repair and related consulting and analytical services for alternative energy systems or renewable energy production (solar, biomass, wind, other); energy audit, energy resource management-related consulting engineering and analytical services.

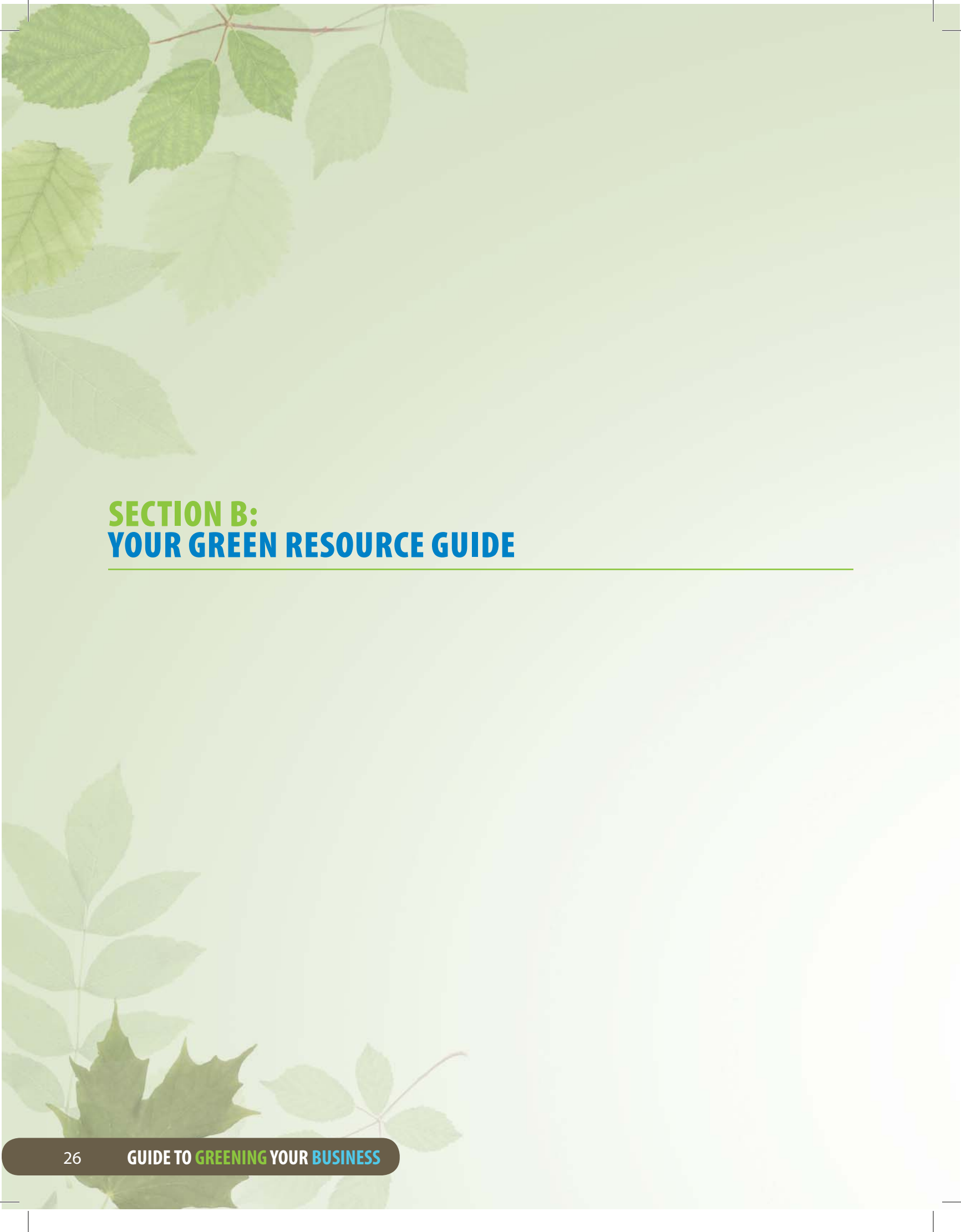
