- Brundtland Commission, 1987



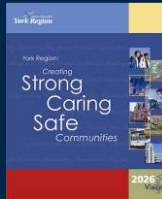
York Region Challenges

- Acceptance by our residents of a compact urban form (NIMBY)

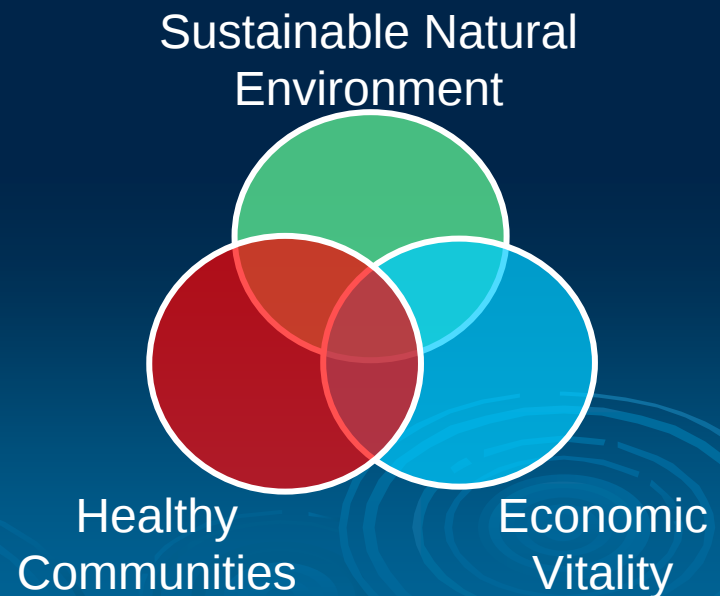


A Sustainable York Region

York Region Vision 2026 (2002)

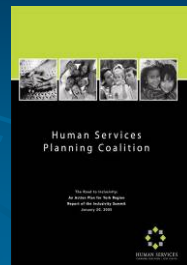
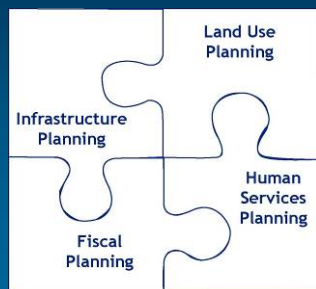


Regional Official Plan (1994)



York Region Successes

- Long Range Water & Sewer Master Plans (30 Year)
- Smart Commute Initiative, & Wind Energy Studies
- Clean Air Corporate Task Force
- State of the Environment Report
- Building Energy Feasibility Study
- Greening Strategy & Oak Ridges Moraine Initiatives
- Affordable Housing Strategy
- Human Services Plan
- Water for Tomorrow Program - saves 22.4 million L of water daily.
- \$40 million recycling plant & commenced composting a separate stream initiative
- Energy and Environmental Management System (EEMS)



Water Efficiency Program



- Target Savings: 19 million litres per day
- Current Savings: 22.4 million litres per day
- Enough water to service a town of 82,000 people

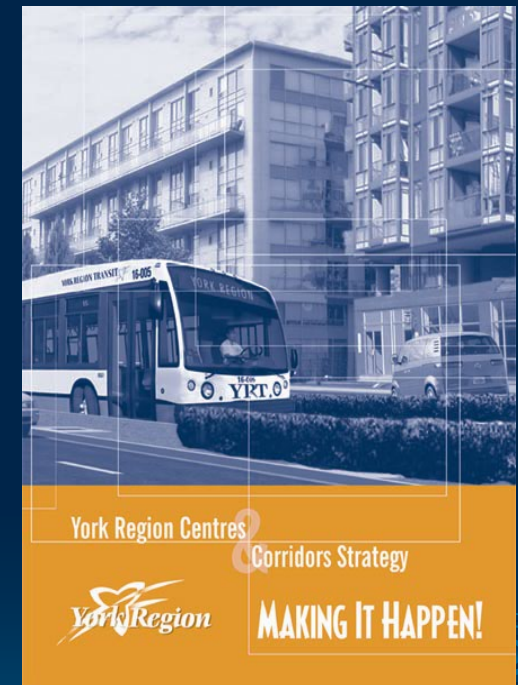

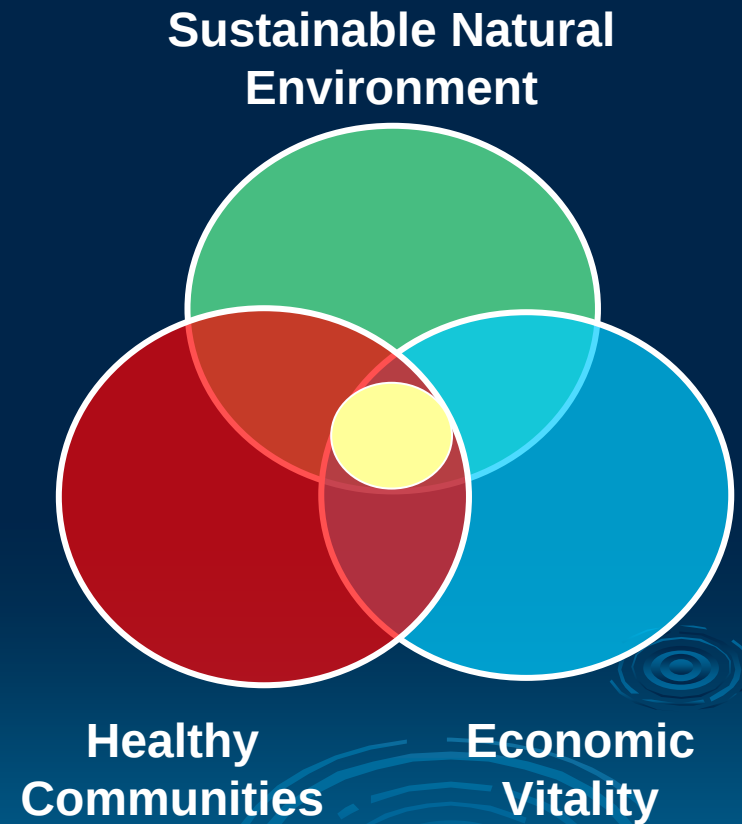
