Project Lifesaver is an International program that was first established in Virginia in 1999.

Since that time 216 Project Lifesaver chapters have been established in 43 U.S. States with 3 chapters in Ontario.

York Regional Police were the first in Ontario, followed by OPP Essex County and in 2010 Peel Regional Police.

This reliable, rapid-response partnership between York Regional Police and Project Lifesaver International assists people who are vulnerable as a result of brain injury, Alzheimer's disease, Autism or other mental health challenges.

Project Lifesaver is not a registry system. It is a proactive response to the growing problem of locating wandering and lost persons before they fall victim to the elements or accidents.

Project Lifesaver emphasizes relationships between team members and the people who may wander before the need arises for a rescue. Team members will visit wristband recipients to install the transmitter and make regular visits to maintain the equipment.

Project Lifesaver team members are specially trained, to communicate with a person who has Alzheimer's disease or other disorders. Members of the Project Lifesaver team know how to approach the person, gain their trust and put them at ease for the trip home.

Clients wear personalized wristbands that emit a unique tracking signal.



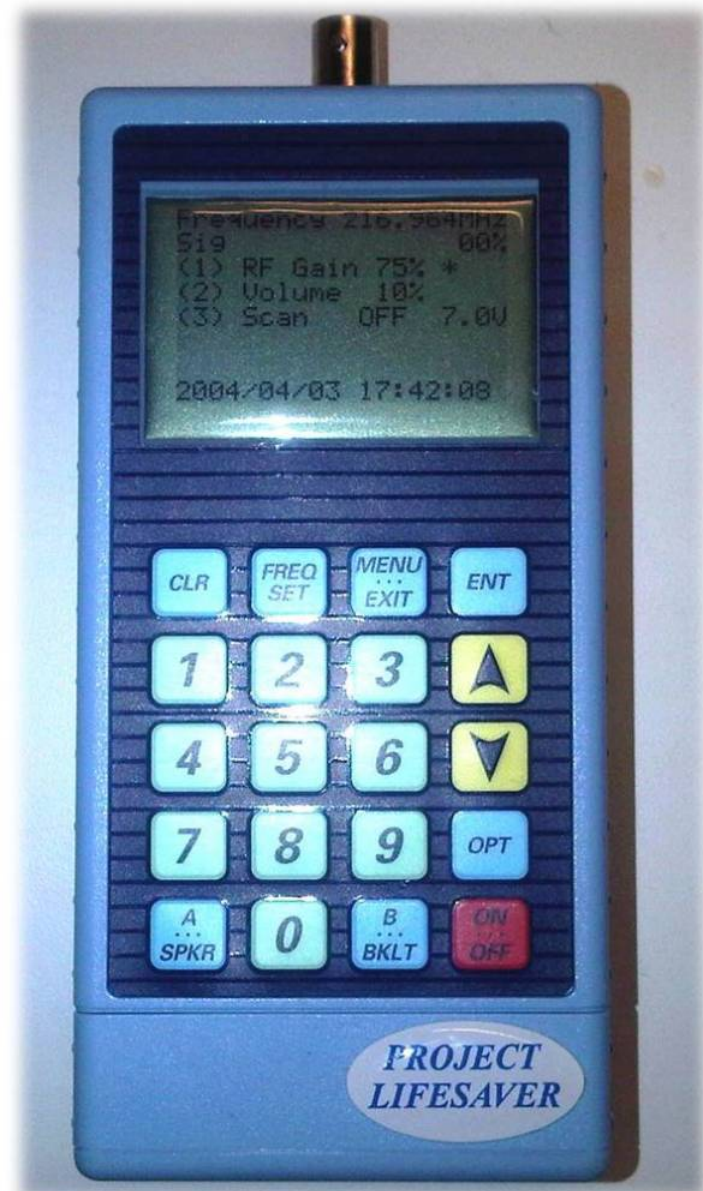
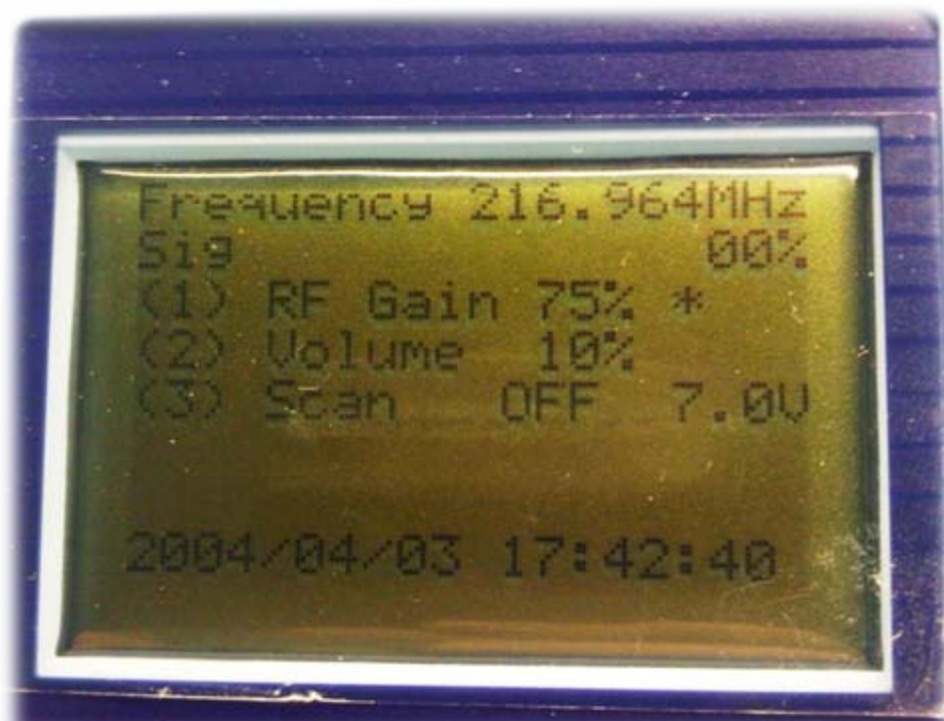


One ounce, battery-operated, wrist transmitter that emits a signal every second.

The Caregiver Agreement States:

The client must have one form or another of diminished mental capacity or ability to communicate

If the caregiver is not abiding by the guidelines, the program can be terminated immediately

It will not replace the care, monitoring, attention and oversight given to the client by the caregiver



Safety measures would still be practiced and adequate support is in place inside the residence.

Participation in the program does not guarantee that York Regional Police will immediately initiate search and rescue efforts to find a missing client nor will York Regional Police find a client.

Search and Rescue efforts will be subject to the availability of police resources.

Vulnerable Person Registry

The purpose of the Vulnerable Person Registry is to assist officers in getting a missing/and or vulnerable person back home

The Flag Record has contact information of parent, next of kin or staff of their group home

Personal information that may assist front line officers in dealing with a crisis situation

When a Loved One is Missing

- Remember in a crisis situation, check your home quickly
- Call 911
- The 911 operator will not be the same person who attends your home, so give as much information as possible
- Try to remember what your loved one was wearing - colour of clothing, shoes, hat, backpack etc.
- Try to stay calm, and think where your loved one may go – did they say they wanted to go get a timbit earlier?
- Stay on the phone with the 911 operator until they tell you to hang up when the officers arrive on the scene
