Background

- ❑ Street furniture design guidelines approved by Council in June 2009
- ❑ Street furniture design approved by Council in May 2010
 - ❑ Shelters
 - ❑ Benches
 - ❑ Bike racks
 - ❑ Waste recycling containers

Street Furniture RFP

- ❑ RFP issued for street furniture with advertising in November 2009
- ❑ Successful proponent to supply, install and maintain street furniture and provide revenue to the Region
- ❑ Region allows advertisement with limitations

Street Furniture RFP

- ❑ RFP allowed for separate bid submissions:

a. Waste recycling containers



b. Shelters, benches, bike racks



Street Furniture RFP

- ❑ Waste recycling container portion of street furniture RFP awarded in November 2011 to Creative Outdoor Advertising
- ❑ RFP for other street furniture (shelters, benches, bike racks) failed and contract with existing shelter contractors extended

Waste Recycling Container

- ❑ Contract commences August 2012
- ❑ Prototype is being developed and scheduled for installation and evaluation in Fall 2012
- ❑ Installation at new vivastations on Highway 7 in 2013

Waste Recycling Container

- ❑ Region assumes waste recycling pick-up in January 2013
- ❑ Replacement of existing waste units commences in 2013
- ❑ Additional expansion locations commences in 2014

Shelters

- ❑ As an interim measure, existing shelter contracts with CBS and Pattison extended to December 2013
- ❑ Includes development of six prototype shelters/benches/bike racks
- ❑ Prototypes scheduled for installation and evaluation in fall 2012

Street Furniture

- ❑ Initial plan to release new Street Furniture RFP in early 2013 and award in late spring 2013
- ❑ Monitor market conditions to determine if timing of the Street Furniture RFP (shelters, benches, bike racks) is favourable to the Region
- ❑ Explore new advertising revenue-generating opportunities with vivaNext build that does not impact street furniture design

Shelters

- ❑ Heritage shelters to be maintained within heritage districts if requested by local municipalities
