Dear Messrs. Heath and Wong,

I would like to bring to your attention a dangerous stretch of 14th Avenue from 9th Line and running west to Havelock Gate. There have been numerous excursions off this road by vehicles travelling in both directions. The south side of 14th Avenue (between the two Boxwood Crescent entrances) clearly indicates these accidents by the number of missing trees along the boulevard that were destroyed by out of control vehicles "ploughing" into them.

These accidents occur throughout the year and the most recent one happened a few weeks ago where trees on the boulevard were again destroyed. I have asked for these trees to be replanted but the region has decided that it would be futile to do so since they will only be destroyed again by out of control vehicles. I can live with this but what bothers me most is that pedestrians like myself are at risk whenever we walk along this stretch of 14th Avenue. Human life is even more valuable since trees are easily replaceable.

I have suggested that strong pylons, a couple of feet in height be imbedded, a few feet apart along the boulevard, so as to protect the pedestrians in this area (that use this stretch of sidewalk on a regular basis), from out of control vehicles.

As it currently stands, this stretch of 14th Avenue is very dangerous for pedestrians and something must be done to protect them.

Your help with fixing this problem would be deeply appreciated by all, I'm sure.
